RE: State of Georgia Annual Report on Opioid Settlement
Date: September 5, 2025

Section V(a) of the [“State of Georgia and Local Governments: Memorandum of Understanding Concerning National Distributor and Johnson & Johnson Opioid Settlements”](#) (hereinafter the “2022 MOU”) and [Section IV \(a\) of the 2023 Memorandum of Understanding](#) (hereafter collectively the “Settlement Documents”) require that the State, through the Trustee, provide an annual report detailing amounts received, awarded and actually disbursed. This report is responsive to and intended to satisfy the substantive requirements enumerated in the aforementioned section of the Settlement Documents.

As of June 30, 2025, the Georgia Opioid Crisis Abatement Trust (hereafter “Trust”) has received a total of \$191,244,615.95 from the National Manufacturers and Distributors and the Big 5¹ Settlements.

Further, the Trustee, in conjunction with the State of Georgia, reports that for fiscal year 2025 \$56,523,518.49 was deposited into the State Treasury from the settlements governed by the 2023 MOU.

The Trust is utilizing the Georgia Fund 1 (hereafter “GF1”) account to pay attorneys’ fees and expenses as well as an investment vehicle. The Trustee granted the Governor’s Office of Planning & Budget (OPB) access to this account in order to pay the approved attorneys’ fees and expenses on behalf of the Trust under the 2022 MOU.

¹ The Big 5 Settlements refers to Teva, Allergan, Walmart, Walgreens, and CVS, which are the subject of the 2023 MOU and underlying settlement agreements.

This and future reports include income, expenses, and evaluation through the end of the fiscal year. As Trustee, it is my opinion that the resources are being utilized appropriately by the State and Regions recognizing that the first round of GOCAT contracts took effect March 15, 2025. The Trust has contracted with the University of Georgia's Ralston Institute for Behavioral Health and



Developmental Disabilities to assist in evaluating the effectiveness of the Trust's abatement spending. At this time, I am unable to express an opinion on resource usage by Local Governments as the Trust and local governments are still in the process of receiving reports from Local Governments.
